

## Poems for Annotation

By the beginning of class on [redacted], you should have 3 poems chosen that all focus on the same topic. (If you want to challenge yourself and write about poems on separate topics, you must get [teacher's] approval before class on Tuesday.)

Copy and paste only the 3 poems that you have chosen into a separate document and print them out.

At the start of class on [redacted], you will fill out a survey telling [teacher] which 3 poems you have chosen.

\*Note: This final poetry essay will be incredibly difficult (and probably not very fun) if you choose poems at random. Spend some time putting thought into which poems you would like to analyze.

### Poetry Exploration Graphic Organizer

Use this graphic organizer to take note of the poems that stand out to you during your initial run-through of the poetry reader. You do not have to record every single poem on this chart, but you do need to take note of at least three.

Remember to look out for poems in particular that you think you can compare and contrast in the final task!
