Peer Feedback Form

Observe, Appreciate, Question, Suggest

Observe means to notice what another person's piece of writing is supposed to do, and to say something about the design or purpose. For example, you might say, "I noticed that you used strong emotional words like 'weep' to put the reader in the right mood for the story."

Appreciate means to praise something in the writing that impresses or pleases you. You can find something to appreciate in any piece of writing. For example, you might say, "Your strong argument changed my opinion," or " with your description, I really feel like I'm there in the story."

Question means to ask whatever you want to know after you've read the author's piece. You might ask for background information, a definition, or an explanation. For example, you might say, "When you mention that the main event was interesting, that doesn't tell us very much. What do you mean by interesting? Is interesting positive or negative?"

Suggest means to give helpful advice about possible changes. Offer this advice honestly and politely – how you would want to get suggestions about *your* work. Be specific and be positive. For example, you might say, "I noticed that your description of the setting was very short. I think the story would be more powerful if you added more background to help the reader to understand where the story takes place. What do you think?"

You will read your partner's letter and fill out the appropriate Observe, Appreciate, Question, Suggest sections on the following page. Aim for at least 1-2 sentences per section.
